The Global Health Education and Learning Incubator at Harvard University seeks an Instructional Design Specialist to support our global health educational programs and initiatives.

### **About GHELI**

The Global Health Education and Learning Incubator (GHELI) is an interfaculty initiative whose mission is to support education about global health challenges, and to develop new pedagogical tools and instructional strategies that be used by educators in a variety of settings. We prioritize key knowledge-gap areas that leverage the depth and breadth of expertise across the university, and that target interdisciplinary global health problems residing at the nexus of broader social challenges and global risks (e.g., emerging infectious diseases and pandemic risk, environment and climate change, displaced populations and food security, rising non-communicable diseases, etc.). We are particularly committed to innovation in learning design that involves multimedia and creating high-quality short-form content that can be integrated into a variety of learning experiences.

## **Position description:**

- Provide public health and global health expertise, supervision, and mentorship to staff working on
  materials we disseminate through our educational repository (e.g., teaching and learning resources)
  and our web (e.g., global health news stories). Work with the faculty director and senior digital team
  at GHELI to refine processes and procedures for updating and maintenance of repository core
  resources.
- Create thematic overviews, primers, backgrounders on global health challenges that will be used to support many of our core curricular materials and coordinate the development of new integrated learning experiences and online lessons accompanying major global health reports. Contribute to a strategy to disseminate these materials through our educational repository and targeted outreach.
- Coordinate and support the **construction of thematic resource packs** on interdisciplinary global health challenges, which are curated collections of resources for teachers and learners. **Create use cases** to provide guidance for educators wanting to develop their own curated collections of resources.
- Collaborate on the development of online instructional materials for our high priority educational
  initiatives, working with our instructional designer, multimedia team, and staff. Support Faculty

Director and educational team to adapt public health educational materials emerging from our undergraduate and graduate classroom laboratories to an online format that can be used by teaching fellows across the university, as well as educators looking for teaching resources in our repository.

As a public health expert, play a central role in our dissemination plans and outreach activities. These
include developing and conducting workshops that provide opportunities for Harvard
undergraduates and graduate students from all schools to get involved with global health teaching
and learning. Serve as an ambassador for GHELI to visitors onsite and foster relationships across the
university and with our partners through monthly digital newsletters and collaborative activities.

This position will report to the Associate Director of Educational Initiatives. Direction and priorities for the position will be determined by the GHELI Faculty Director.

GHELI places a high value on the in-person experience and community building, along with the functions of this role, the position will be 100% on campus. There will be opportunities, though for occasional "hybrid" work.

- Bachelor's Degree
- Experience teaching public and/or global health minimum of 3 years of related experience.
- Experience with project management and supervision of staff.
- Superior written and oral communication skills.
- Exceptional interpersonal, organizational, and negotiation skills.
- Strong interest in public and global health education.
- Candidates wishing to be considered must supply a cover letter in addition to a resume.

- Masters preferred or advanced degree in public health or a closely related field.
- Strong collaboration skills with ability to exercise independent leadership and work collaboratively with others in a small team environment.

- Ability to problem solve and work efficiently in the context of multiple competing deadlines in a dynamic academic environment.
